From 2017, Indigenous Peoples in Bangladesh, Bolivia, Cambodia, Cameroon, Colombia, Kenya, Nepal, Peru, Philippines, Suriname and Tanzania have used the Indigenous Navigator to monitor their rights and development.

The resulting data reinforces their struggle for recognition and protection of their rights and supports their advocacy and engagement with policy makers.

To be sustainable and transformative, the COVID-19 response and recovery must be respectful of indigenous peoples' rights, respond to their realities and leverage indigenous peoples' contributions to "building back better".

The virtual event offers a platform for Indigenous representatives to share about the situation of their communities and perspectives on building an inclusive and sustainable COVID-19 response.

It seeks to contribute to the identification of strategic actions for advancing a recovery that contributes to realization of the SDGs and implementation of the Paris Agreement on Climate Change.

The event coincides with the launching of a set of new global Indigenous Navigator reports presenting insights emerging from data collected since 2017, including a report on COVID-19.



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
