A momentous step after a decade long unrelenting struggle of indigenous leaders advocating for the collective rights of forty-six indigenous communities in Thailand. The Draft Bill once passed will ensure the State's recognition of Indigenous Peoples, the "Chon Phao Phuen Muang", a welcome departure from the current categorization as Thai ethnic groups; leading to in no uncertain terms, the recognition of the unique identities, cultures, and protection of the livelihoods of the Indigenous Peoples of Thailand.

In alignment with our commitment to sustainable development, AIPP has spearheaded initiatives that prioritize environmental conservation, cultural preservation, and livelihood empowerment such as developing the Indigenous Knowledge and Data Sovereignty framework and the Indigenous Navigator project in consultation with our country partners. We are acutely aware that missing data means missing people; therefore, these initiatives aim to create a harmonious balance between protection and the preservation of indigenous cultures and ecosystems through data collection from indigenous communities by indigenous communities. We also made compelling arguments through narratives and counter narratives by indigenous journalists who form the bulwark of indigenous affairs by generating public interest media aimed at changing public opinion.

Throughout the year, AIPP has facilitated knowledge exchange programs, workshops, and training sessions that aim to build leadership across sub regions involving diverse intersectional indigenous groups. By fostering a culture of learning and innovation, such as our interventions regarding the impact of emerging technologies and Artificial Intelligence, we continue to strengthen our resilience in all directions.

And as we have sustained a culture of sharing and paying it forward, we have also forged critical partnerships with like-minded organizations and stakeholders. These partnerships have allowed us to

amplify our impact and extend our reach, creating a network of solidarity and support for indigenous communities.

As we celebrate these achievements, we also acknowledge the challenges that lie ahead. The journey towards justice, equality, and empowerment is ongoing, and we are committed to facing these challenges head-on in the coming year.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to you for your continued support and collaboration. Your dedication to the cause of indigenous rights has been instrumental in the success of AIPP's endeavors.
